4.29 Comments on Land Court case Exhibit 34 being Dr. Chris Taylor's affidavit and report

Dr. Taylor is a Queensland resident who is not registered as a professional engineer. Despite this he makes engineering calculations and forecasts based on engineering assumptions. He provides advice on chemical engineering topics of heat and mass transfer and the impacts of human production of carbon dioxide yet has no engineering qualifications.

Dr. Taylor claims two science qualifications yet his advice contradicts empirical evidence that is at the heart of the scientific process. From experience it is more likely that an engineer would have recognised the clear breaches, omissions and contradictions of empirical evidence that Dr. Taylor does not identify.

Many of the issues addressed in my complaint about Professor Hoegh-Guldberg's advice to the court in testimony and in his written report apply to Dr. Taylor's report.

I question the action of McCullough Robertson lawyers in requesting Dr. Taylor to provide advice on engineering matters.
